God's greatest unchanging gift is Jesus. "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (Hebrews 13:8). Jesus never changes. He never has to move. He keeps on loving us and saving us and holding us close. In the midst of the changes of life, we give thanks we can rest in the unchanging nature of Christ.
