Don't be afraid

When a child has stolen a cookie from the cookie jar and gets caught, most of the time that child is fearful of the consequences and discipline that he or she might receive. As we grow older the fear of consequences and discipline doesn't change. When you see the red and blue lights in the rearview mirror, your heart sinks. While living in Maryland I was involved in a car accident and received a ticket. I went to court to try and reduce the fine and consequences. Standing before the judge over a simple traffic ticket was extremely stressful and scary for me. I can't imagine what it would be like to commit a worse crime and have to stand trial! My point is that no matter our age, no one likes to stand before their accuser, or in front of a judge, or even an angry parent or spouse.

As I was reading through Hebrews for a devotion I was struck by the relationship of Jesus Christ as fully God, yet also as fully man. I was also reminded that Jesus fulfilled a unique office, he became our great High Priest. One of the jobs the high priest fulfilled in the temple worship of God was to intercede to God for the people's sins. Hebrews 4:14 and following explain that Jesus was not just our high priest, but the Great High Priest. One of the reasons why Jesus is aptly called the Great High Priest and not just a high priest is that Jesus offered one sacrifice one time, and that sacrifice covered the entire world's sins. This is magnificent accomplishment alone is amazing.

One of the amazing things about Jesus as our Great High Priest is that He walked in our shoes so to speak. He was fully human. He was tempted in all ways, yet never sinned. Jesus struggled, was attacked by feelings of fear and loss, and even endured horrible pain. Hebrews 4:15 clearly explains this to us, "For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin." (ESV) We serve a God who got down in the trenches with us, got dirty, experienced what we

The result of this truth is profound on many levels. But one of the truths that results from Jesus doing what He did is found in the next verse, "Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. (Heb 4:16, ESV) We come to God's throne room as dirty children who have sinned and fallen so far short. We have every right to be fearful of the judgement of God. However, because of the mercy of God shown to us by our Great High Priest Jesus, we are welcomed into the throne room of God. As we look down at ourselves expecting to see filthy rags resulting from our sins, we see new clothes that are pure white, and radiant. For the Great High Priest has made full satisfaction for our sins.

Instead of being fearful expecting punishment, we are able to walk right in to God with confidence the Bible says. Through faith in Jesus we are forgiven sinners. Now God sees us as adopted children, who are perfect, holy, and pure. This is not a result of our feeling of sorrow over sin, nor our works to try and make amends. We are forgiven only because God has fully poured out His wrath resulting from our sins on to the sacrifice the Great High Priest has brought forward for us, Himself. God's demands of justice have been met. Now we are imputed or bestowed the full grace, mercy, and forgiveness for all our sins. We in essence have clothed ourselves in the righteousness of Jesus. So next time you are tempted. Next time you fall into temptation and sin. Don't fear God, run to Him. Approach the throne room knowing that Jesus the Great High Priest has taken care of everything!
