When you walk around in really big cities it is almost like your eyes, ears, and nose are assaulted! The smells come from street vendors peddling their food, as well as a mixture of rotting trash, and human odor. One's eyes can easily become over stimulated from the flashing neon lights, sky scrapers shooting out of the ground, and the vast assortment of people and their clothing choices that scream for your attention. The sounds of a major city are a mixture of heavy traffic, the dull hum of countless people milling about, and occasionally even street musicians filling the air with "music". Often these musicians are playing on plastic tubs, old beat up instruments, or on rare occasions multi-million dollar instruments that belong only in the hands of master musicians. Such was the case in 2009 in Washington D.C.

A man dressed as a beggar unpacked a violin worth 3.5 million dollars and gave the people of D.C. a treat! This man was world renown master violinist Joshua Bell. As he played six selections written by Bach (a composer most experts believe was the greatest composer ever), most people walked right by him too busy to notice, or too oblivious perhaps to even care. He like other street musicians had a place to leave money to "tip" or pay for the music that was being provided for all to hear. Most would only throw money in the hat without even bothering to notice or to pay attention to the melody that rang true from Joshua's violin.

At the end of Joshua's performance on the street he collected just \$32.00 when just a few nights previous he packed the Boston Theater out where the average seat to hear him play cost \$100. Why did so many people ignore this master? Why did so many miss this free opportunity? After the Washington Post reported this, there were no doubt many who remember walking by this "street performer" and didn't bother to stop and

listen. They missed an opportunity of a lifetime.

Psalms 19:1-2 reminds us that, "The Heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky above proclaims his handiwork. Day to day pours out speech, and night to night reveals knowledge." (ESV). We are surrounded by the work of the Master of all masters. Every morning the sun rises to reveal a stunning display of God's work and power. Every night the sky twinkles and hints at the vastness of God's creation. Have we grown oblivious to the glory of God because we have been around it too much? Have we become too used to seeing the majesty of God's creation that we have become blind to it?

I want to encourage all of us to spend some more time marveling at God's creation. If you are out driving and notice the sunset, pull over get out and spend an extra minute or two on your trip to praise God. When you are driving down the coast don't ignore the vast ocean out your window, ponder the greatness of God who created such an amazing thing at a simple verbal command. Encourage your children and grandchildren to find the beauty in all of creation. Use the vastness of the night sky to move you to contemplate some of God's eternal attributes. Don't be one of those people who walk past a master ignoring him ply his trade. Stop and make time to marvel at God's handiwork as you enjoy the beauty and wonder of His creation.


