Are you feeling overwhelmed and distressed?

I don't know how you are feeling right now, but if I can be honest, I have been distressed and greatly troubled concerning the state of our world, country, and region more than I care to typically admit. I try not to watch too much news because I typically grow despondent over the reporting of what is going on around us. Yet even with my brief skimming of news sites that I tend to peruse, I find myself sometimes being filled with dread and even anxiety. There seems to be a constant war being raged continually somewhere. Then there are rumors of wars with various adversaries that are looming. Nationally there appears to be a relentless pursuit of deviant behavior by our government, corporations, and private individuals that seek to embrace what the Bible clearly explains as sinful and wrong. It is as if people are actively seeking to take anything good, wholesome, and righteous, and call it wrong, destructive, and evil.

What bothers me perhaps the most is that very young children are being targeted by radically evil people in our culture through social conditioning. We once encouraged our children to watch Mr. Rodgers who sang a song telling children that, "Boys who are born boys stay a boy, and if you born a girl you stay a girl and grow up to become a lady." Now we send our kids to public schools that have some teachers and guidance counselors attempting to indoctrinate children as young as two that gender is fluid, and that it is good and healthy to experiment sexually. It seems as if the culture we live in is lifting up all manner of horrible and destructive behavior and beliefs and calling that good. I sometimes wonder how much worse the world was before Noah was rescued by God through the flood. For Genesis 6:11-12 tells us how bad things were then when it says, "Now the earth was corrupt in God's sight, and the earth was filled with violence. And God saw the earth, and behold, it was corrupt, for all flesh had corrupted their way on the earth."

So the big question is what do we do about it? One of the worst things we can do is throw up our hands and say, I can't do anything to change the culture so why bother. We can sell all we have, buy a bunch of land and live off the grid. That would probably be a good thing to do for us and any that lived with us. But there are many who can't afford to do that, and we would essentially be giving up to the forces of evil that have pressed their attack. I believe that what God has called us to do is stand up for the truth and fight back.

Stand up and live out our faith in such a way that people see a difference in who we are and how we live. As more and more evil behavior becomes normalized, it will become more and more important for Christians to live as Christ and not as the world. Some of us will be called to be politically involved. Others might be called to mentor a young neighborhood child. Perhaps some will be called to teach in public schools and be a light in an increasingly hostile place for people who follow after Jesus. Spend some time in prayer asking God what He wants you to do, and do it.

For those of you like me who sometimes struggle with finding hope in the midst of this difficult time, I want to leave you with this encouragement written by the Apostle Paul to a church who also was surrounded by horrific sinful behavior. 2 Corinthians 4:16-18 says, "Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal."
