

## The Power of Forgiveness

Some across the world have really enjoyed watching the mini-series about Jesus and His followers called "The Chosen." The newest season will be released in the theatres this month. The series portrays events that could have happened to Jesus and His followers mixed in with true events from the Scriptures. While some events portrayed in the series did happen very closely to how the series played out, there has been some creative license in some events portrayed where the Bible is silent. While these events should be considered fictional, how the events play out in the series could have very well happened. Furthermore, we get a better glimpse at the historical events that were happening in Jesus' day and how they might have affected Jesus and His followers. If your family is looking for a wholesome entertainment option, I would recommend it.

In one of the scenes Jesus was talking to a child, who was telling Jesus about a bully. It was obvious that the child was struggling with anger toward this person, and wanted to fight back. Jesus didn't get angry with the child, or scold him, but rather helped the child see that it was God's place to administer justice, and showed from the Scriptures that revenge is not what a God-fearing person should seek.

As I reflected on this, I began to think about all the injustices that have been happening in the world. While Christians are beginning to be persecuted more in America, active persecution of Christians has been commonplace in the world throughout the centuries. While I was in seminary, a man named Peter from Africa was in my class. Peter shared stories of Muslims in his country who would mutilate and torture Christians. Some in his own family had even been on the receiving end of such treatment. As more time passes it seems that Christians are less safe, even here in America. Sadly, as we get closer and closer to the end of the world and the 2<sup>nd</sup> coming of Jesus, the Bible tells us that persecution will only increase!

So how can we prepare? What should Christians do to ready themselves for the increase in persecution? Instead of arming ourselves with guns and bombs, we should arm ourselves with God's Word. There are many Scriptures that provide clear guidance on this issue. 2 Thess. 1:6 -8, Deut. 32:35, and Rom. 12:17-19 are just a few of the many verses that provide clear Biblical clarity on this matter. Furthermore, we are to remember that God will judge all people, and this is not for us. And those who die continuing to reject the calling of God to repent of their sins, well they will be severely judged and punished in hell for eternity. The coming judgement for unbelievers will be swift and severe. This is something that even our worst enemies should not experience. The short answer is that we must learn the art of forgiveness.

While persecution will increase from unbelievers (and we kind of expect that), sometimes persecution occurs from those that we don't expect- fellow believers! Sometimes this type of persecution is the hardest to forgive. Afterall, they should know better right? For those of us that are, or have been persecuted by Christians, we would do well to remember the great debt we have been forgiven by God. For if God can forgive us our debt from all our sins, any persecution we endure by our brothers and sisters in Christ should be quickly and completely forgiven as well. It stinks when it happens, and one would hope that it wouldn't happen, but it does.

As crazy as it sounds, the more we are persecuted, the more we have the opportunity to demonstrate one of God's most important actions toward others- forgiveness. Instead of growing angry or bitter when you suffer, count it all joy. James chapter 1 verse 2 reminds us of this truth. Not only does it help us to develop steadfastness in our faith, it helps others to see something different in those who follow Christ. If we want to change the world, it starts with the people that surround us. Forgive them, as God has forgiven you, you forgive them. May our actions speak louder than words in showing the world the transformative power of Jesus' love and forgiveness.
